Open and introduction

Background about neighborhood and occupation

- 3. What are the demographics like --- age, SES, race and ethnicity?
 - a. Would you say that you interact with people from different racial, religious, or cultural backgrounds in your neighborhood? What are those experiences like?
- 4. Do you know your neighbors? If so, do you socialize with them?
 - a. If yes, how often would you say you socialize with your neighbors? What kinds of activities do people do to socialize in your neighborhood?

Next, I'd like to hear more about your educational background and community involvement in general

- 5. People report having different kinds of educational experiences. Some report experiences where they interact with people who are culturally or religious different from them while others report attending schools and universities that are more homogenous. Thinking about your education, did you meet people whose experiences were culturally or religiously distinct from your own? [skip if short on time]
 - a. How did those experiences make you feel?
 - b. If immigrant: Have you had any educational experiences in the United States? How did these experiences compare to your educational experiences abroad?
- 6. Are you a member of any type(s) of social, cultural, civic, or community organizations?
 - a. If yes, ask what kind of organization

 - c. How often do you participate in meetings or events related to this organization?

- 7. If they don't mention religious institutions, ask explicitly. Do you attend a church, temple, mosque, or other place of worship?
 - a. How often would you say you attend?

 - c. What kinds of events do you participate in?
- 8. How important is religion in your daily life?
- 9. [Exclude Latino Muslims] Have you ever met someone of the following faith groups?
 - a. [We can list a few] Note: Muslim should be included here.

Experiences and perceptions with discrimination

Perceived commonalities with Muslim Americans

- 29. Over the last few years, there has been a wave of violence against Asian Americans. How important is it for people like you to stand up against this violence?
- 30. What about the Black Lives Matter movement? Is it important for Latinos to support BLM? Why do you think that?
- 31. Okay, turning next to immigration policy. What have you heard lately about what either of the two parties is doing on immigration policy? How important of an issue is this for you in _____? Is it an important issue you think needs to be fixed?
- 32. During the Trump presidency, there was an executive order that banned people from primarily Muslim countries from coming to the United States or a so-called "Muslim Ban." Were your views mostly favorable, unfavorable or neutral towards this policy? Why do you feel this way?
- 33. Do you think refugees from the Ukraine, who are displaced because of the war with Russia, should be allowed to settle in the United States? Why do you feel this way?
 - a. What about other refugees who have been displaced by war such as people from Syria and Afghanistan?
